

## **Immigration Procedures**

#### Extending Your Visa

Your stay in Japan, authorized by the Immigration Bureau, is called the 'period of stay'. The period of stay and the status of

residence are both determined when you come to Japan or when you change the status of residence. You are allowed to stay in Japan for as long as your stay is authorized. If you would like to extend your stay in Japan, you must apply for permission to do so. Foreign residents in Ehime must go through the procedure at the Immigration Bureau in Matsuyama. The required documents vary depending on your status of residence and your period of stay.

#### Alien Registration Residence Registration

If you are staying in Japan for more than 90 days, you must register to obtain an Alien Registration Card at the Citizens Affairs Division of Imabari City Office as soon as you establish your place of residence.

For your initial registration, you will need your passport and two ID photos. (3.5 cm x 4.5 cm)

To renew your registration, you need your passport (you may need new ID photos or other miscellaneous items depending on your country of citizenship)

### **Driver's License**

**Obtaining a Driver's License** 

A. International driver's license

If you obtain an international driver's license prior to arrival in Japan, it will be valid for one year from the date of issue. This is only applicable to citizens from member nations of the Geneva Convention.

\*The driver's license must not be expired. Valid for one year from the license issue date.

\*It must not be more than one year since your arrival in Japan.

(You must be able to prove that you have more than three months driving experience in your country from the time you obtained your license) B. Switching an overseas driver's license to a Japanese driver's license.
\*Applicants must sit a written test, an eve sight test and a

\*Applicants must sit a written test, an eye-sight test and a driving test.

Applicants from certain countries may be exempted from the written and driving tests, if their driving skills and knowledge of Japanese traffic are considered to be of an appropriate level. (A driving test for a large two-wheeled vehicle will not be exempted )

Exempted countries; Iceland, Ireland, The U.K., Italy, Australia, Austria, Holland, Canada, Korea, Greece, Switzerland, Sweden, Spain, Denmark, Germany, New Zealand, Norway, Finland, France, Belgium, Portugal, Luxemburg, Taiwan. (23 countries)

You need to report to the Center within the hours listed below, and be aware that the procedure can take several hours.

License possessors from exempted countries 8:30-9:30

License possessors from other countries 9:00-11:00, 13:30-16:00 Open Tuesdays and Fridays (except holidays ) You will need the following:

- a. License application forms and examination number (available at the Center)
- b. Driver's license from your country
- c. Passport
- d. Alien Registration Card
- e. One ID photo (3 cm x 2.4 cm)
- f. A Japanese translation of all the information that appears on your country's driver's license. The translation must be done by one of the following; A government office in the country which issued the driver's license, a consulate concerned, or the Japan Automobile Federation (JAF) Ehime Bureau Tel: 089-925-8668
- g. Your personal seal (Signature is acceptable)
- h. The procedure fee 2,400yen application fee, 2,100 yen issuance fee. The total procedure fee differs depending on the license you want to obtain.

\* If you can not speak Japanese, you need to be accompanied by an interpreter.

## Water / Electricity / Gas

If you inform the business office of each public utility several days in advance, service people will visit your residence to disconnect your services and give you the final bills. Also inform the business offices of your new address to have service people visit you on the appointed day to connect the services and note the initial meter reading.

### Water

#### **Starting Water Service**

#### How to request water service

Telephone the waterworks division of Imabari City Office and provide your name, address, telephone number, and date you would like water service to begin.

#### **Bill Payment**

You will be billed every other month. Your water bill may be paid: 1. at the office of the waterworks division.

- 2. at a bank or post office using a bank transfer to the waterworks division
- 3. from your bank or postal savings account by automatic withdrawal.

#### **Discontinuing Service**

Telephone the waterworks division of Imabari City Office at least three days before you would like to stop your water service. Provide your water meter number, name, address, telephone number, and the date you would like the service to end.

### Electricity

In Japan, there are two electric cycles and voltages. In Ehime Prefecture, the current is 60hertz and the voltage is 100volts. Using appliances which do not match the current and voltage may cause damage to both the appliance and the circuits. Be especially careful when using electrical appliances brought from overseas.

- (A) Telephone the electric company and provide your name, address, telephone number, the name of the previous occupant (if known), and the date you would like power to be turned on.
- (B) Fill out and mail the Application Form for Electricity Service to the electric company. The form is usually tied on to your fuse box.

#### **Bill Payment**

Your will be billed monthly. Your electricity bill may be paid :

- 1. at a bank, convenience store or Shikoku Denryoku / Chugoku Denryoku by using the remittance form sent by the electric power company.
- 2. from your bank or postal savings account by automatic withdrawal.

#### **Discontinuing Service**

Contact Shikoku Denryoku or Chugoku Denryoku and provide your name, address, telephone number and the date you would like power to be disconnected, and your customer service number (this number can be found on your monthly statement or receipt).

### Gas

In Imabari, two kinds of gas are used – city gas (toshi gasu) and propane gas. Because gas appliances differ depending on the type of gas used, you should check with your landlord. For more information; City gas and gas leaks:

#### (1) City Gas (Toshi gasu) <u>Starting Gas Service</u>

Contact the Gas Company and provide your name, address, telephone number, and the date you would like gas to be connected. It is necessary for you to be at home when the service representative comes to turn on the gas

#### **Bill Payment**

Your will be billed monthly. Your gas bill may be paid:

- 1. from your bank or postal account by automatic withdrawal
- 2. at a bank, post office, convenience store or Shikoku Gasu Office by using a gas bill payments form.

#### **Discontinuing Service**

Contact the Gas Company two or three days before you would like gas to be disconnected.

#### (2) Propane Gas

#### **Starting or disconnecting Service**

Contact a propane gas dealer. Ask your landlord for information about dealers.

#### **Appliances**

Unlike toshi gas, the gas used for propane appliances is the same nation-wide.

#### **Bill Payment**

You will be billed monthly. Ask your propane dealer about the various methods of payment.

\* Note: When you call outside your own area, you must use the appropriate area code.

#### (2) Pay Phones

Coins and telephone cards may be used.

(Change is not given for 100yen coins).

#### (3) Overseas Calls

At present, various companies offer International Subscription Dialing (ISD) telephone services and the charges vary considerably.

When you decide on a company to use for your overseas calls, you need to register your phone number with the company. For further information, see the website of each company.

(B) at a bank, post office, NTT or a convenience store using a remittance form sent by NTT.

\* Bills for overseas calls are sent separately if you use a different company for international calls.

#### (2) When moving

At least three days before moving, call NTT on 116 and provide your name, address and phone number.

#### (3) Telephone Directories

If you have a telephone, a directory will be delivered free of charge. You can also obtain them from any NTT office.

There are two types of telephone books:

#### A. Hello Pages

In this directory, personal telephone numbers are listed in Japanese syllabic order.

#### **B.** Town Pages

The entries are classified by business or occupation so that you can search for a store or company.

### Keitai Denwa (Mobile Telephones)

Mobile telephones are now widely used because the setup procedure is much simpler than installing a fixed telephone, and you can purchase them at a variety of shops (listed below). With a keitai, in addition to making and recieving calls, you can send and receive messages cheaply and take photos as well. Some mobile phones can be used for international calls.

## **Bank / Postal Services**

In Japan, by far the most common form of payment is cash. Personal checks are seldom used. Credit cards are becoming popular, but some stores still do not accept them.

Popular credit cards are; JCB, VISA, DC, MasterCard. Banks are open Monday through Friday, 9:00-15:00

#### (1) Opening a Bank Account

There is no fee for opening a bank account.

The following are necessary to open an account:

- A. Identification (Alien Registration Card, passport, etc.)
- B. Personal Seal or signature.

\*There are no joint bank accounts in Japan.

#### (2) Cash Card

You can use a cash card at an automated teller machine (ATM) to make cash withdrawals. Some ATMs can also be used for cash deposits. These machines can be found in major stations, supermarkets, department stores and other places as well as the bank. For an additional fee, you can withdraw money from your account using the ATM of some other banks. You can have a cash card made when you open a bank account. When you use the card, you must type in your four-digit secret code number. Bear in mind however, that if you mistakenly use an incorrect code number five times your card will become unusable. Please contact your bank in this situation.

\* Hours differ depending on the bank and the location of the machines. Only ATMs at certain locations can be used on Sundays and Holidays.

\* A fee of 105yen is also charged when using an ATM at these times (withdrawal):

- 1. Monday Friday before 8:45 and after 18:00
- 2. Saturdays, Sundays and Holidays

\*A fee of 105yen is charged when using a different bank's ATM.

(3) Automatic Bank Transfer for Public Utility Bills You can have your water, gas, electricity, telephone bills and NHK fees debited automatically from your bank account. The application procedure can be handled at the finance counter of your bank. The following are necessary:

- A. A receipt or bill from each company
- B. Your account passbook
- C. The registered personal seal used with your account or your signature

\*If you need to make an overseas remittance, Lloyds Bank is convenient. You need to register the payee in advance. If you pay money to Lloyds from an ATM at nearby bank by 15:00, the telegraphic transfer will be made on the same day.

(A fee of 2000yen will be charged)

### Postal Service

The main services of the post office are; collection and delivery of mails and parcels, remittance (domestic/ overseas to certain countries), savings, automatic transfer for public utility bills from the account and insurance.

With your postal savings passbook or cash card, you can withdraw money from your account at any post office in the country. (Free of charge)

## **NHK Television Receiving Fee**

All television owners are expected to pay the NHK receiving fee.

You can pay the fee by;

- A) Paying the collector who visits your home.
- B) Paying at a bank, post office, or a convenience store.
- C) Having the fee automatically withdrawn from your bank or post office savings account.

You will be billed every two months. The typical fee for a color television is 2,690yen or 4,580yen for NHK satellite TV. If you choose to pay using option B) or C), the fee will be discounted by 100yen. Further discount is available for 12 months advance payment.

## **Garbage Collection**

There are three different garbage bags assigned for collection by the city office; yellow, white and green. Each color is intended to be filled with a specific type of garbage. To find out the collection dates and locations for your neighborhood, please ask a neighbor or call the City Cleaning Department (Seisou-ka) on 0898-36-1534 with help from a Japanese interpreter if you don't speak Japanese.

The designated plastic bags are available at supermarkets, convenience stores and other local shops. The bags cost the same city wide: Large (10 bags) - 300yen, Medium (10 bags) - 200yen and Small (10 bags) - 150yen. When you want to throw away large objects, call the Sodai-gomi Center on 0898-25-3300 (again with help from a Japanese speaker if necessary), and ask for the collection schedule in your area. Please note that the Sodai-gomi center cannot collect electrical appliances such as personal computers and the other appliances listed below:

The following **appliances** have to be disposed of by an electrical appliance shop, according to the Household Appliances Recycle Law.

- \* TV set (about 2,700yen + carrying charge)
- \* washing machine (about 2,400yen + carrying charge)
- \* refrigerator & freezer (about 4,600yen + carrying charge)
- \* air conditioner (about 3,500yen + carrying charge + detaching fee)

#### **Garbage Rules**

- Burnable garbage must be put in Yellow bags.
- e.g.: (food scraps, paper, wood, clothing, leather goods, etc ...)
- Soft plastic garbage must be put in White bags.
- e.g.: (soft plastic products, wrap, etc...)
- Unburnable garbage must be put in Green bags.
- e.g.: (pottery, glass, rubber, metals, shoes, small electric appliances, etc...)

#### **Recyclable waste**

is collected twice a month, on scheduled days, from a recycle station in each neighborhood.

Please put out any recyclable material by 8:30 in the morning.

The following items can be recycled:

- 1) cans (for food and drink) 2) polyurethane bottles (for juice, liquor, or soy sauce) 3) colorless white bottles
- 4) brown bottles(glass) 5) other colored bottles(glass) 6) newspapers and any newspaper inserts 7) magazines
- 8) cardboard 9) paper packages (milk containers, etc.) 10) useable old cloth(es)
- $(1) \sim 5)$  should be separated and put into the specific container at the recycle station.
- $(6) \sim 10)$  should be bound with string after being folded, without putting them in a bag or wrapping them.
- \* Polyurethane bottles, bottles and cans should be rinsed, and their caps should be taken off.
- \* Old newspapers and cloth should be bound with twine separately.
- \* Bottles for beer and sake should be returned to a liquor shop.
- \* Hazardous waste (dry batteries, fluorescent tubes, mercury thermometers) can be collected at a recycle station.
- \* Button batteries and batteries which can be charged repeatedly should be taken back to a shop for recycling.

## **Hospital Visits**

If you become ill, or you are injured in an accident, go and see a doctor as soon as possible. Make sure you bring your insurance card. If you are not insured, you'll have to pay the full cost of medical treatment. On holidays, or in case of an emergency during non-consultation hours, go to a designated emergency hospital. (For inquiries about emergency hospitals, call Imabari City fire station on 0898-32-3300)

- When you arrive at the hospital, you should show your insurance card at the reception desk and fill out a form similar to the one below. If you can't read Japanese, you should take this example with you.

#### Health Insurance

If you have permission to work or study in Japan for a year or more, you must be covered under the National Health Insurance Plan (Kokumin Kenko Hoken) or a health insurance affiliated with your place of employment (健康保険 Kenko Hoken).





## Japan Railways (JR)

Train tickets can be purchased at the automatic ticket vending machines at the station. Press the button of your destination and it will show the fare. Insert money to get your ticket (change will be paid). If you purchase the wrong ticket, you can ask a conductor on the train to change your ticket, or a station worker to adjust the fare after arriving at the station.

In order to ensure you are in the correct carriage, you must be aware of the Kanji: 指定席 (reserved) and 自由席 (unreserved)

Tickets for long-distance travel outside of Shikoku or reserved seats can be purchased at the Midori-no-Madoguchi ticket office, which is located at the left side of the automatic ticket vending machines. When you pass through the ticket gate, generally you turn to the right to catch a train toward Takamatsu and turn to the left to catch a train toward Matsuyama, but you should always consult the digital information board.

Trains are a lot busier during spring and autumn, when a lot of people take holidays. In particular during Golden week (from the end of April to the first week of May), summer holiday (from late July to the end of August), mid-August and the beginning / end of the year, the trains will be so crowded that booking in advance is the best way to ensure you have a seat.

#### **Getting Change**

Get change if you need it. A money changer is by the bus driver. Put your 1000yen bill or coins in the machine, in the end of the fare machine facing the passengers, and your change will shoot out into the bowl at the bottom of the machine.

<u>Note</u>: It is advisable to get change BEFORE you arrive at your destination, as you will create a *queue* behind you sorting things out at your bus stop if you don't.

#### Getting on the Bus

Board by the rear door. You will see a ticket dispenser. Take a ticket as you get on and note your number. Be sure not to sit in the designated senior citizen seats (unless you are one.)

#### **Paying your Fare**

Calculate your fare by looking at the number on the digital fare board at the front of the bus that corresponds to the number on your ticket. So, if your ticket reads "2". Look for "2" on the fare board, and pay the price indicated when you get off. The fare box is usually a clear plastic box on the top of the machine with a little conveyer belt. Make sure you throw in your ticket too.Note: Prices on the board DO CHANGE; The longer you ride, the more expensive the fare becomes.

## In case of Emergency

#### : In case of traffic accidents or crimes



In case of crime, or a car accident, dial 110 and you will immediately be connected to the police headquarters' command room. When using a personal telephone, dial 110. Public pay phones have red emergency buttons for calling 110 and 119 (24 hours). These calls are free.

Jiko desu. Sugu kite kudasai Tasukete kudasai. = There has been an accident / crime.= Please come at once.= Please help me.



#### : Fire Department and Emergency Ambulance Service (24 hours)

In case of emergency, such as a sudden illness or serious injury, call 119 and tell them your name, address and phone number in order to request an ambulance. They will do their best to find a hospital suitable for your symptoms or send an ambulance. There is no charge for the ambulance.

> Kega wo shiteimasu.= Seriously injured. Kyubyou desu. = Sudden illness.

In case of fire, dial 119 to report the fire by saying "Kaji desu!" (There is a fire). Then provide information such as your name, address, telephone number, and the place where the fire is by specifying a nearby big building or

### In case of disasters such as typhoon and earthquakes

### earthquakes

(Check your neighborhood evacuation areas and evacuation routes in advance.)

\* Keep away from roofing tiles, and balconies.

#### When you are in the room

\*Protect yourself and others by staying under a table, or standing in a doorway.

\*Wait until the earthquake stops, then turn off the gas.

\*Put out any fire/flame as soon as possible.

\*Leave the doors and windows open to secure an evacuation route.

\*Evacuate as soon as possible.

#### When you are out-of-doors

\*Residential districts: Keep away from walls and gates made of stones.

- \*Near the sea or mountains: Keep away from the seashore and steep slopes. Listen to the radio or TV to get information about possible tsunami.
- \* Urban areas: Cover your head with something like a handbag or briefcase, keep away from high buildings, evacuate to an open area Keep away from fragile things such as glass, sign posts, advertisement boards, tiles that may fall or shatter. Never touch electric wires.
- \* While driving: When you realize an earthquake is happening, slow down and stop on the left side of the road. Wait until earthquake stops.
- \* On the train: The train may stop suddenly. Hang on the strap. Don't get out of the train until you are told to by *train staff*.

### typhoon

\*Put away your laundry and plants and keep them indoors.

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\*Prepare flashlights and candles in case there is a blackout.

\*Be aware of your surroundings. IF you feel you are in danger, evacuate to your evacuation area.

 ★ Always have your valuables and emergency supplies ready: Valuables / radio / cell phone / food for emergency / first aid kit / flashlights / battery / clothing / as well as any miscellaneous items you consider important.
